### **About the Performance**

#### ***An Evening with Petula Clark*, Saturday, November 6, 2010, 6 p.m.**

Petula Clark first broke into the limelight during World War II when as a child she entertained the troops, both on radio and in concert performing 200 shows for the forces. In 1944, Clark made her first movie and has since appeared in more than 30 British and American films. Throughout the forties and fifties Petula was a regular guest on radio and experimental TV. Her prolific recording career began in 1949 when she recorded her first song *Music, Music, Music*. Since then, she has never stopped recording and to date has sold well in excess of 68 million records.
