Palm Springs Art Museum Announces December Events, Ongoing Exhibitions and Other Special Activities

PALM SPRINGS, Calif. (Nov. 30, 2015) – Palm Springs Art Museum presents a variety of performances, special events, family activities and exhibitions taking place in December. Each of the three museum locations offer something different, with a range of engaging experiences and intriguing exhibitions.

The Annenberg Theater has several exciting performances scheduled for the month. CK Dance Company's *The Nutcracker* performance is on December 4 at 7:30 p.m., and December 5 at 3:00 p.m. This 19th annual production features Tchaikovsky's ravishing melodies for a charming production with a wealth of dazzling dances. Tickets are \$25 and \$30. *Dance with Miss Lindsay* returns with her annual Winter Recital on December 6 at 2 and 5 p.m. Dancers from 3 years old to adult perform in stylish costumes to traditional and nontraditional holiday classic songs. Tickets are \$20 and \$25.

Continuing at the Annenberg Theater on December 8 and 9 is Todd Murray for Cabaret 88 at 7 p.m., with a 6 p.m. reception preceding the performance. Tickets are \$88. Following on December 12 at 8 p.m., Maureen McGovern takes the stage with *Sing My Sisters, Sing!* The popular singer and actress has a career that has spanned more than 40 years and has included Oscar-winning songs. Ticket prices are \$65 and \$75, and \$5 off for museum members. Italian tenor Pasquale Esposito performs on December 20, from 7 to 8:30 p.m. Celebrating the greatest tenor of all times, Enrico Caruso, Esposito and his stellar band of international musicians will take the audience on a musical journey highlighting the places, songs and events that made Enrico Caruso an international star. Ticket prices are \$55 and \$65.

The Annenberg Theater Council debuts its *Take Your Seat!* campaign. For a onetime contribution of \$1,000 a name can be etched into a handsome plaque mounted on the back of an Annenberg Theater seat of choice. This can be an individual's name, a family name, or a name to be honored. The goal of *Take Your Seat!* is to raise \$400,000 for critically needed technical upgrades and new equipment that will bring the beautiful 20th Century auditorium up to 21st Century productions standards. Campaign Sponsor John P. Monahan, owner of THE FIVE HUNDRED, has completely underwritten the costs of this campaign so that every penny contributed goes toward theater improvements.

The museum is participating in the *Walking Tour of the Inns* and Holiday Toy Drive for Well in the Desert on December 10, from 4 to 8 p.m. From 100-year old adobe inns and 1920's jewels, to Mediterranean inspired villas, the walk includes Casa Cody, Old Ranch Inn, Orbit In, Korakia Pensione, Calla Lilly Inn and several others. Those partaking in the walking tour start at the museum to receive maps, flashlights, and a coupon for 10 percent off purchases made at The Bradford W. Bates Vault: The Museum Design Store at the Architecture and Design Center, Edwards Harris Pavilion, which is included in the walk. The museum is also accepting unwrapped toys to be donated to the Well.

Supporting the exhibition *Killer Heels: The Art of the High-Heeled Shoe* is the "High-Heeled" Film Series featuring *Marie Antoinette* (2006), taking place December 10 at 5:30 p.m. Director Sofia Coppola puts a new spin on the life and times of one of Europe's most infamous monarchs in this lavish historical drama which fuses a contemporary sensibility with painstaking recreations of the look of the 18th century. Also on December 10 and December 13, is an on-site shoemaking demonstration by LA-based shoe designer Chris Francis, who will also have his designs on display. The demonstrations take place on December 10 from 4 to 8 p.m., and on December 13 at 1 p.m. as part of *Free Second Sunday*.

Free Second Sunday on December 13 is also themed around the last day of the wildly popular Killer Heels exhibition, and includes the following activities:

Art for All Ages Sheffer/Scheffler Arts Education Space in the Hoover Gallery 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Shoe Sculpture Guests can design miniature shoes using nontraditional materials like wire, foam, found objects, and feathers to create their own unique killer heels.

Artists in Action James and Jackie Lee Houston Atrium 1 p.m. Attendees can investigate the intersection of art and craft with shoe designer Chris Francis demonstrating his process as a self-taught shoe maker.

Film Upper Level Lecture Hall 2 p.m.

The Wizard of Oz, directed by Victor Fleming and starring Judy Garland, begins with Dorothy tapping her magical pair of ruby slippers that transports her and her

dog Toto on a journey through the land of Oz to meet the Wizard. Everyone says he can help her return home, and grant her new friends their request for a brain, a heart and some courage.

Artful Conversations Hibbert Orientation Center 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. Tour the exhibition *Killer Heels: The Art of the High-Heeled Shoe* for an intriguing look at how an everyday item of clothing can be elevated to an art object. For the tour, meet at the Admissions Desk.

Now in its thirteenth iteration, LUEY (Let Us Entertain You) is back with a calendar full of fabulous dinners, intimate cocktail parties, and wildly creative gatherings to delight and entertain. Produced by the Museum Associates Council, several fundraising events take place through April. Divine, Wine, & Dine takes place December 1 at 6 p.m. For \$250 per person, participants will experience Palm Springs' newest addition to uptown, EIGHT4NINE Restaurant & Lounge, with craft cocktails, tray-passed hors d'oeuvres and a diva-worthy fourcourse dinner paired with fine wines in the Michael Childers Room. Childers will join the event with intimate stories about his Fusions series and his career as a celebrity photographer.

The next LUEY event is on December 9 at 6 p.m. Guests will be treated to creative cuisine, delightful entertainment and fine wines in Uptown Palm Springs. The first stop for libations and entertainment is at Christopher Anthony Ltd, followed by appetizers and a sampling of signature dishes at the James Beard Award-winning Workshop Kitchen + Bar. Finally, more signature dishes and delectable desserts will be served at Trio. The cost is \$250 per person.

The Galen First Fridays in partnership with City of Palm Desert First Weekend, features the band brightener on Friday, December 4 at 7:30 p.m. brightener is the recording and performing moniker of Palm Desert-based folk-pop singer-songwriter Will Sturgeon. On December 5, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., a Winter Solstice Celebration includes winter inspired art making, festive snacks, and a special holiday performance in the magical Faye Sarkowsky Sculpture Garden, filled with twinkling holiday lights. *Wrap it Up!* is a wrapping paper activity in which participants use unique stamps, craft paper and printer's ink to create special paper to wrap holiday treasures. *Crafting in a Winter Wonderland* explores different paper cutting techniques and sparkling paper to make snowflake decorations for holiday celebrations. The performances take place in the sculpture garden at 11 a.m. and 1 p.m.

Hall* on December 16 at 5 p.m. Hall will present her drawing and painting techniques and she will discuss other artists' approaches whose works are in the Still Life exhibition. The event is free.
