Palm Springs Art Museum Fundraiser and Exhibition *ARTrageous* Returns January 24 to February 22 Bringing Together 75 Donated Artworks

PALM SPRINGS, Calif. (January 19, 2015) – The Contemporary Art Council (CAC) of Palm Springs Art Museum announced the return of the exciting exhibition and fundraiser, *ARTrageous*, taking place January 24 through February 22, and culminating with an exciting auction of the artworks on February 23. The exhibition is in the Joseph Clayes III Wing of Palm Springs Art Museum and includes 75 intriguing artworks in various media donated by museum patrons, major collectors from across the country, artists and galleries.
